Message from our Golf Course Superintendent



The holidays are here! Heck, it even snowed last night!!

It's hard to believe that 2021 is winding down to a close and another year is upon us. As always I like to view this as an opportunity to both look back at the season and forward to the future.

I want to update everyone on the routine ongoings of the golf course maintenance department. The irrigation system was successfully blown out this past week. We almost had an issue with our compressor not being available from the rental company, however Skip did a fantastic job pivoting and secured a slightly larger one from another outfit. As usual it was a cold, windy day, not ideal for messing with water, but we accomplished it close to within a normal day. Our winterization of the pump house is a service that we contract out to ensure all components are properly prepared for the winter months. During their inspection a small fitting was found that will need to be replaced, nothing major by any means, especially considering the age of our system.

Let's talk trees, our favorite discussion point! We have removed two trees thus far off of the approved list. We will continue to pick away at this list throughout the winter months, hopefully able to make some headway on the many dead/decaying trees on the creek bank. The other topic related to trees would be the leaves making a mess everywhere. It never ceases to amaze me how clean an area looks after being picked clean of leaves, only to immediately return to a disheveled state after a sturdy gust of wind. This year has been a little odd as it seemed that a bunch of leaves dropped early, yet looking up in the trees last week a daunting amount remains. I fear we will be battling this for the majority of December, but it has to end at some point, right??

I think overall the golf course was a success this past year. I'm not sure that our green speed ever necessarily reached its peak, however I think they were more consistent this year. Fairways are a bit dinged up in spots, but definitely not from the fairy ring disease that we have been battling recently. We are committed to making strides on some of our steeper fairway areas for 2022. Some of this definitely stems from lack of/malfunctioning irrigation, obviously making it difficult for us to maintain a full stand of turf in these areas.

Fortunately many of them are not landing areas and do not see a lot of golf traffic.

Let's hope that there are a few decent golf days remaining to wrap up 2021. If so, we will see you out there!!

Frost Delays

How can a footprint be a killer?

It's hard to believe that simply walking or driving a cart across the turf covered with frost can cause so much damage. The proof will be there in a few days as the turfgrass is severely damaged and leaves a trail of cart tracks or brown footprints. That's why most courses will delay starting times until the frost has melted. It's also why golfers who appreciate a quality golf course will be patient during frost delays.

Why does frost cause problems?

All of the turf on the course is fragile. All fine turf surfaces are extremely fragile environments that must be managed carefully and professionally. Remember that every surface is a collection of millions of individual grass plants, each of which is a delicate living thing. Obviously, Mother Nature never meant for these plants to be maintained at such low heights and intense traffic for prolonged periods. This stress makes the turf constantly vulnerable to attacks from insects, disease, heat, drought, cold, -- and frost. Frost is essentially frozen dew. It can form when the temperature (or wind chill) is near or below the freezing point. The ice crystals that form on the outside of the plant can harden or even freeze the cell structure of the plant. When frosted, the normally resilient plant cells become brittle and are easily crushed. When the cell membranes are damaged, the plant loses its ability to function normally. It's similar to cracking an egg. Once the shell is broken, you can't put it back together.

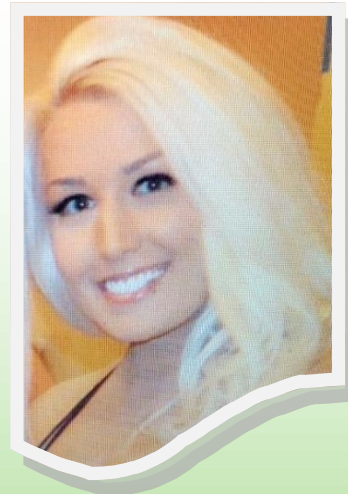
