

Message from our Golf Course Superintendent



CCC Members,

Hello summer! Sure enough July has arrived and we have already experienced our fair share of heat and spells without rain. We were fortunate to have received $\frac{3}{4}$ " of rain last night and look to get some more today, but all clearing out for a promising holiday weekend!

For those of you that participated in the Member Guest tournament a few weeks ago, the golf course maintenance team is hopeful that you enjoyed the event and the golf course. I received numerous compliments on the course conditions, which are always much appreciated. The golf course could have played better, particularly on Sunday, however the environmental conditions just did not allow for that. We can do the exact same thing to greens, such as mowing and rolling, but it is difficult to overcome the stickiness that exists on days with higher humidity levels. All considered, I was very happy with our efforts and have come to accept the fact that we cannot control the weather, sorry to break it to you!

We have entered a very crucial portion of the year which will determine our success moving forward into late August and early fall. I have stated this before but will continue to do so...just as with football, defense wins championships! Our "championship" is really just surviving the summer to have a successful fall golf season. The "defense" I am referring to has more to do with being smart about how we set the golf course up on a daily basis during extreme heat/humidity/drought. You may notice some days that the greens are a little slower in their pace. This is most likely due to us either just mowing or just rolling, not both, and furthermore there may be mornings that we decide to skip any activity on the greens at all. This is very rare but would be considered on days consisting of upper 90 to low 100 degree temperatures. Currently we have been giving the greens a break as we have the holiday weekend coming up followed by our Stringfellow district tournament the very next weekend. Expectations are obviously very high for these events and we have every intent to meet if not exceed those, but in the meantime we are going remain intelligent about our decision making.

Don't miss our annual "Repairing of the Fairway Divots" outing just prior to Stringfellow on Wednesday, July 7th at 5:30. Men, please join us while the lady folk are enjoying their Twilight Golf Clinic with Dan. Ladies not attending clinic welcome, too! This is a great way to help improve our course and we'll have fun (and maybe a drink or 3), too! Please RSVP with Vince or Dan.

I would like to wrap this up by voicing my immense amount of appreciation to the membership involved in formulating the employee appreciation day. My team has always thoroughly enjoyed this event and I feel there is great value for them to actually play the conditions that we produce daily. 

Repairing of the Fairway Divots






